Seminar Length:

Daylong sessions are 7-8 hours including lunch and coffee breaks. 1,2 & 3 day seminars are available.

Curriculum:

Fall Arrest, Fall Protection/ and Rescue are required topics. All other topics are developed through discussion with the client to determine their needs and expectations.

Format:

Setting:

Small table and a tall stool for presenter.

Equipment:

Video projector with VGA cable. A small PA system for larger rooms. Projection screen or similar surface. White cyc or scrim will work. Blackboard, whiteboard or similar large surface for impromptu drawings.
